



n April, 62-year-old Sparta resident Bob Lucas was fatigued, had a cough and was not eating. He had a 102-degree fever for eight days, with sweating and chills – shivering throughout the night. Then he lost his sense of taste and smell. But he thought he could ride it out at home.

"My family kept pushing me to go see my doctor. On April 19, my wife, Sabrina, and my children, Paige, Sara, and Nicholas pleaded with me to make an appointment – so I did. On April 20, my doctor examined me and said due to my symptoms I needed to get to the hospital immediately." Bob chose to go directly to Newton Medical Center.


NEWTON MEDICAL CENTER EMPLOYS 'LIVING ANGELS'

Bob immediately received critical attention – everything from continuous nursing care, heart monitoring, available oxygen, compassion and even coffee at 3:00am.

"I was awake; I rang the buzzer for the nurse, whose name was Kristine. I asked her for a coffee. Kristine came back with the coffee and brought me some graham crackers. She sat down and talked to me. She said to me that I was going to be OK. She told me that I was going to beat this and not to give up. I know she had a lot of work to do and other patients to see, but she stayed with me and helped me feel better. A living angel," Bob remarks.

"The nurses and everyone on 2 West always had a smile on their faces and always a kind word, no matter what the time of day," says Bob. "They were always saying, 'What can I get you? How can I help you?' They encouraged me to keep fighting the virus and made sure I was comfortable all the time."

All of Bob's children were born at Newton, and he experienced equally good care more than 27 years ago when his first was born. He also had some minor surgery done at the hospital and knew it was the place to go if you were ill.

Gina Marie Fioriti, DO, visited Bob every day. His recovery plan was taking hold and by April 24, his symptoms had decreased. "My breathing improved, and I got better day after day. With the work of Dr. Fioriti and the grace of God, I am here today," Bob says gratefully.


Dr. Fioriti visited Bob in the morning. She said, "Can you get a ride home? If things keep going the way they are going, you can be released on Monday." Bob was feeling better and made plans to go home. "Dr. Fioriti and her consistent attention basically saved my life. What a wonderful person and dedicated physician," says Bob.

"It would have been easy for them to give up on me. But they didn't," Bob exclaims. "I can never thank the doctors and nurses enough for sticking with me and winning the fight against this virus. I owe you my life, and I am forever grateful."

Bob advises that if you are choosing a hospital because you are having a baby, minor surgery or facing a disease, Newton Medical Center should be your choice for care.

"Newton Medical Center saved my life. They have to be the best to beat this disease. From the doctors and nurses, to the cleaning and food service, they knew how to take care of a very sick person and how to make me physically and emotionally well. I am forever grateful," says Bob.

If you or a loved one have persistent COVID-19 symptoms, you're not alone.

Shortness of breath, extreme fatigue, anxiety or depression, tachycardia (racing heart), joint pain, chest pain, cough, memory loss and brain fog are common and can linger for weeks, sometimes months.

The Atlantic COVID Recovery Center cares for patients with symptoms that persist beyond 30 days after contracting the virus. The program provides care in two areas:

- Specialty care & peer support groups for former ICU patients
- Specialty care for symptomatic patients

A dedicated care coordinator helps guide each patient through the process — from arranging appointments and test authorizations to acting as a patient liaison and coordinating services, which can include: primary care, cardiology, pulmonology, neurology, rehabilitation medicine and behavioral health.

Urgent Care Centers Offer Convenience and Quality Care

hen injuries or illness happens, it's always a relief to know that medical care is close to home. With the Sparta and Newton urgent care centers, located in Sussex County, you can be assured of receiving prompt quality care when you need it.

"Urgent care centers provide a convenient as well as a lower cost setting for people who need to be seen urgently," says Paul Marmora, vice president, Ambulatory Care at Atlantic Health System. "In the past, you either had to get an appointment with your physician or sit in an emergency room. The urgent care centers provide convenient access."

"The urgent care centers feature on-site testing with stateof-the-art equipment, in addition to wellness services for our community. Our treatment tools and equipment is state of the art," says Bob Adams, president, Hackettsown and Newton medical centers. COVID-19 testing is available for patients by appointment at Newton Urgent Care. Each center also offers virtual visits with a telehealth professional. Using the phone or videoconferencing, patients can discuss their symptoms with a medical professional and receive treatment recommendations.

A range of injuries and illnesses can be treated at an urgent care center, including accidents, cold and flu, or infections. Wellness services include vaccinations and immunizations, as well as pediatric physicals for extracurricular activities.

According to Marmora, "Atlantic Health System has a strategy of expanding urgent care centers throughout the northern areas of the state. We're trying to bring as many of these throughout our service area for the convenience of our patients."

The Healing HEARTS Project

ecently, Newton Medical Center Foundation embarked on a \$1.4 million campaign to fund a new Cardiac Cath Lab imaging system in the Charles L. Tice Heart Center. This state-of-the-art technology offers a comprehensive suite of functionality customized for a wide range of procedures including percutaneous coronary intervention (PCI) for STEMI patients.

STEMI patients are those who are having an acute myocardial infarction (heart attack). With the flat-panel digital detector, it offers excellent visualization of the heart and its chambers. The system is designed from the ground up to provide the image clarity needed to support well-informed decisions.

The interventional field is growing with ever-expanding capabilities and migration to less invasive, safer and more cost-efficient procedures. With this new technology and advanced interventional imaging software, clinicians can expand their versatility and successfully plan, guide and assess



increasingly sophisticated procedures with greater precision and dose efficiency.
