Before you're faced with a health crisis, make sure you plan ahead and know the nearest urgent care and emergency care locations, hours, ages treated, and insurances accepted.

 <p>Pediatrician/ Family Medicine</p>	Appointments preferred; online appointments and virtual visits available	Business hours, some evenings/weekends	Well and sick visits, moderate health concerns that need to be treated quickly	Newborn to 21
 <p>Urgent Care</p>	No appointments needed, walk-in care, virtual visits	Business hours, weekday evenings/weekends	Convenient, same-day medical care for mild to urgent health concerns	Call in advance; site and clinician dependent
 <p>Atlantic Health Advanced Urgent Care</p>	No appointments needed, walk-in care, no virtual visits	7 days/week (8:00am - 8:00pm and Saturdays/Sundays 8:00am - 5:00pm), 365 days a year	Immediate care for minor to complex illnesses or injuries. CT scans, X-rays, comprehensive on-site labs are available	All ages
 <p>Hospital Emergency Department (ED)/ Pediatric ED</p>	No appointments needed, walk-in care, no virtual visits	Open around-the clock, 365 days a year	Life-saving care, severe mental or physical health concerns that need to be treated immediately. The ED is supported by the full hospital and its medical staff.	All ages
